What is the VMAP Recognition Badge?

The Virginia Mental Health Access Program (VMAP) is pleased to offer a Recognition Badge to providers who have completed one or more of VMAP's intensive education programs. This digital badge serves as a symbol of their personal and practice commitment to improving pediatric mental health. Any primary care provider (PCP) treating patients 21 and under in Virginia is eligible to participate in these education opportunities.

How To Receive a VMAP Recognition Badge

A provider must have completed one of the following VMAP education programs:

- **ECHO** (attend at least 80% of the scheduled sessions)
- **QI Project**
- **REACH PPP** (complete 3-day training)
- **Triple P (Positive Parenting Program®)** (complete 2 day in person training *and* become Triple P accredited)



Provider Education Opportunities

VMAP ECHO

Virtual cohorts that meet monthly with tracks for specialized interests in pediatric mental health. Learn valuable specialty skills that you can bring back to your practice.

Quality Improvement (QI) Projects

Designed to improve the quality of pediatric mental healthcare services. Completed with a VMAP ECHO cohort or as a standalone initiative.

REACH PPP

Mini-fellowship followed by case-based distance learning. Focused on identifying pediatric mental health concerns, managing psychopharmacology, and implementing treatment plans.

Triple P–Positive Parenting Program®

Helps PCPs support parents dealing with challenging child behaviors. Aims to create supportive family environments, as well as prevent and treat pediatric behavioral and emotional problems.
