The Problem



Virginia ranks **48th lowest** in the U.S. in access to youth mental health care

(State of Mental Health, 2023)



100% of Virginia localities are mental health professional shortage areas

(VDH 2023)



65% of pediatricians say they lack training, knowledge, & skills in pediatric mental health

The Solution

The Virginia Mental Health Access Program (VMAP) is a FREE statewide initiative that helps primary care providers (PCPs) take better care of children and adolescents with mental health conditions.

How VMAP Helps PCPs



The VMAP Line

- Free same-day consultation with pediatric mental health specialists regarding patients 21 and under.
- Care navigation to help their patients connect with mental health resources.



Provider Education

• Expert-led pediatric mental health trainings that teach PCPs how to manage pediatric mental health.

VMAP has trained over **1,100 providers** to better screen for, manage, and treat pediatric mental health conditions.
